
In-depth Zimbabwe D2

Trip dates: 10 October - 19 October 2020

Location: Hwange National Park & Mana Pools, Zimbabwe

Group size: 4; Cost GBP 7,695 per person

BASED AT A REMOTE, NEW **PRIVATE CAMP ON A CONCESSION** WITHIN HWANGE TO BEGIN WITH, AND THEN TRANSFERRING TO AN **EXCLUSIVE-USE** TENTED CAMP IN MANA POOLS ON THE SECOND PART OF YOUR ADVENTURE, YOU WILL BE GIVEN **PLENTY OF TIME TO MAXIMISE A FULL RANGE OF PHOTOGRAPHIC OPPORTUNITIES**, FROM LION PRIDES AND WILD DOG PACKS TO STANDING ELEPHANTS AND EYE-LEVEL HIPPOS.



COSTS AND LOGISTICS

- Group size: 4 guests only
- **GBP 7,695 per person**, based on twin-share accommodation
- Start point: Harare International or Victoria Falls International Airport the choice is yours!
- End point: Victoria Falls International Airports
- **Note:** the price quoted includes a bush flight from Harare International at the beginning of the trip as that is slightly less than flying from Victoria Falls. However, should you wish to use that routing at the start of your trip, let us know and we can make alternative arrangements. There is an additional fee for flying that route, but it is not much more expensive and we simply pass on the surcharge at cost. Our advice would be to **END** your trip with a visit to Victoria Falls as we will road transfer there from Hwange. As such there is no extra cost. You can then head back to Johannesburg from there at the end.

WHAT'S INCLUDED...

- 4 nights accommodation at our remote, private concession camp in Hwange National park
- 5 nights accommodation and exclusive use of Little Vundu tented camp within Mana Pools
- All meals and drinks throughout the itinerary
- Private vehicle throughout the trip at both locations
- · All guiding fees, both for vehicle viewing and tracking on foot
- Meet & Greet at Victoria Falls International or collection from hotel
- Road transfer from Hwange National Park to Victoria Falls
- Bush flight transfers at start of trip, and also from Mana Pools to Hwange National Park



WHAT'S NOT...

- International and/or any domestic flight to/from the itinerary start/end points
- Items of a personal nature
- Visa fees as appropriate (if required, you pay these in cash on arrival at immigration)
- Departure tax for bush flights from either Harare or Vic Falls (US\$15, payable in cash)
- Gratuities

YOUR ITINERARY....

Days 1-5: Arrive in Mana Pools (5 nights)

You will be met by Andy from your inbound flight into Mana Pols (via Harare or Victoria Falls – included). Either flight takes around 90 minutes. Depending on exact routing, this can be a spectacular flight over the Kariba Dam and down the Zambezi valley on the way, with Zambia on one side, and Zimbabwe on the other. On arrival, we transfer to our private-use tented camp on the banks of the Zambezi – with no other guests – and after settling in, will head off on our first exploration of the area!

Over the five days that we head out from this very special, unfenced base – through which it is not unusual to share with elephants during the day – we will explore the woodlands, floodplains, pools and drainages which make up the mosaic of Mana. It is in this period that we will be focusing even more on predators, particularly African wild dog and lion, as well as some of the most iconic bull elephants in southern Africa. In fact, sometimes we might get so close to the subjects…on foot…that we would almost be able to touch them. Under the guidance of our personal, armed guide – and I work with some of the best in the entire country – we may be able to have some truly adrenaline-pumping experiences, pushing your photography to an entirely new level. We will also provide the opportunity for a canoe trip one afternoon (wind permitting!), giving you the chance to be up close and personal to elephants, hippos and crocodiles and give you the chance for some great wide angle shooting from an entirely different perspective. Nights will bring us clear skies – most of the time! – and depending on moon phase, we will grab the chance for some incredible astro-photography also….there's nothing like an African sky in the dry season!

Days 5-9: Fly to Hwange; transfer to our lodge (4 nights)

After our five nights in Mana Pools, we will be taken to the airstrip for our flight (around 90-120 minutes) to Hwange National Park. From here, we will be collected and taken to our remote camp on a 10,000 hectare concession within the National Park in time for lunch, and our first exploration of the surrounding bush that afternoon.

After a first exploration the day before, and a good night's rest, we will spend the next 3 full days exploring this wildlife-rich, remote and not often visited, part of Hwange National Park. We will be able to spotlight and off-road on our concession also when appropriate, and with just four (plus me in the front of course!) in the vehicle, you will have plenty of room to work in. Because of the concession area, we will be able to walk when the situation demands it, or we feel an opportunity would be best exploited that way, and we can spend plenty of time accessing the central part of the south-eastern section of the park also. This is some Hwange's most remote, yet wildlife-filled, wilderness areas and a chance to get images not captured by thousands of others.

Day 10: One last safari...and onward!



EXTENSIONS...BEFORE AND AFTER...

There are a number of options for those visiting the region at this time of year, and we will be pleased to arrange some suggestions for you.

Because of the location of the start of the trip, Victoria Falls is an obvious choice if you have never been (or, actually, if you have and want to experience the mighty Mosi Ai Tunya again!), and as you will be accessing Zimbabwe through this airport anyway, well, it would easy to start your trip a couple of days earlier and take in this natural wonder. We can arrange a special rate at the iconic Victoria Falls hotel before your Hwange experience, if you wish – our suggestion would be a two night stay. Vic Falls is of course an easy flight to Johannesburg.


