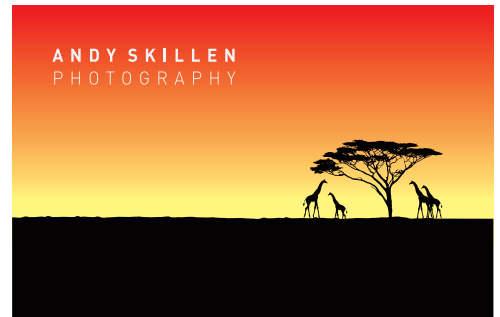


Fancy a chat?

1. How can I book you for a talk?

Simply dropping me an email is the best way to go. I'm often out of the country, so an initial phone call might go unanswered. I'll always promise to reply as soon as I have connectivity, but that's not always immediate 😊

2. How far in advance should I request you to come to our society/club etc?

As far as possible. Last minute options are very rare for me simply because I might not see your request for a month or so if I'm overseas. I will always reply though, so chuck me some ideas and hold a date or two, and I'll do my best to reply as quickly as I can.

3. Do you speak all over the UK?

Yes – and overseas too by special arrangement. In the UK I have given talks from Harrogate to Cheshire, Bristol to Brighton and all places in between. Many clubs have been spoken to more than once. I am based in South West London, so most places are accessible. **If you are a corporation looking for motivational and/or after dinner speaking or a day's training, then please contact me directly for availability and rates.**

4. How long are your talks and how many do you do?

They can be tailored according to need. For most club talks however, they will be in two parts, each of about 50 minutes. Sadly, travel restricts my talk dates in any year to when I'm in the country, so I have to cram them in. That means limited options, but if I can do it, I will. I usually do around 4-5 in a year depending on timing.

5. What can you talk about?

My talks are anecdotal: behind the scenes of professional wildlife photography and documentary making. They will tend to whisk you around the globe discussing previous and ongoing commissions and contain video, music, voice-over and of course stills. They are high energy and hopefully thought provoking. Presently I focus on two main talks: "A Wild Life" and "Walking with Bears".

6. How much do you charge?

Fees for talks from photographic clubs are donated to charity, so there is no set amount. However, because I am only able to do so few in a year, I do have to make it work for the charities in terms of maximising the return. Fees have ranged from GBP190 – GBP600. On larger charity nights, we've managed to raise over £3000 with ticket sales etc. However, don't panic! Anything that is donated goes an awfully long way 😊 If your club is small, then perhaps combining with another will help stretch the budget. I tend not to charge petrol unless it's a very long trip.

7. What kit do you need?

I bring my own macbook, projector and speaker. I am happy to use your projector if calibrated but have no worries about plugging mine in. Otherwise water and a cup of tea is all I need 😊

8. Can you talk on Zoom?

Only specialized technical talks can be done this way. My normal talks are full of so much video and music that Zoom is not a supportive platform and as such, talks are given in person all over the country. The reaction of the audience is just as important and the opportunity to engage is key. Rights issues over broadcasting are also a problem with Zoom unfortunately and as such the distribution of my "in person" talks such services is not really possible – sorry!

9. How do I know if you're the right person for us?

Well...you can google me, look up the website or perhaps read some of the following recommendations from societies I've talked to in the last 12 months. I look forward to hearing from you!

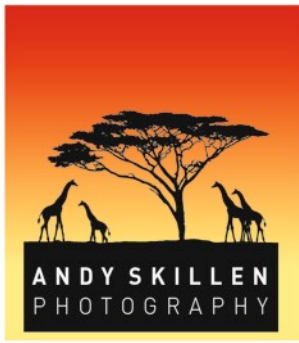
